### Holiday Hazards & Winter Safety

As the holidays approach, we need to start thinking about keeping your pet safe. Here are some reminders to help get them through the season.

Chocolate, Mistletoe, Holly, Amaryllis bulbs are just a few things that are toxic to pets. Keep them out of reach. Check out our list of Poisons on our website.

Prevent your pet from playing with holiday decorations, light strings, tinsel, ribbon, etc. Injury, electrical burns, or ingestion obstruction can occur.

Road salt & de-icer are irritating to paws and the GI tract. Make sure anything you spread on the sidewalk is pet safe. Prevent your pet from licking the sidewalks or snow banks where salt may be. Also wipe your pets' feet with a towel after going outside to remove any salt debris from between their toes.
